SUMMARY STATEMENT:

EIC received sales tax of \$342,775 in September 2020, which is 11.6% higher than September 2019. This payment represents tax collected on sales in July. Sales tax continues to outperform budget, despite the COVID-19 pandemic. Sales tax detail for September showed strength in the City's two largest categories, retail and manufacturing. Increases in the retail category were led by home improvement, big box stores and online retailers. In addition, EIC received \$1,000,000 in loan proceeds from KPUB in September.

At year-end, for financial reporting purposes, we will adjust the financial statements to show accrual rather than cash basis accounting. This means that sales tax revenue will be adjusted to reflect the 12 month period that sales occurred rather than the 12 month period when sales tax was received. The estimated sales tax adjustment is broken out separately

on the revenue analysis. Our final FY2020 sales tax numbers for financial reporting purposes will not be available until we receive sales tax in November (for September sales). Please let me know if you are interested in discussing the accounting rules further. To provide the best information for EIC decision making, monthly reports will continue to focus on actual cash balances.

On the expense side, all KMM agreements were finalized and executed, including the purchase of property (\$1,772,468) and payments related to legal and engineering fees (\$16,276). In addition, EIC paid \$26,564 for Doyle School architect fees and permit fees and made regular monthly payments for administrative and debt service commitments.

Following this activity, EIC ended September with a cash balance of \$2,399,126. Looking ahead, the cash flow forecast shows cash balances ranging from \$2.0 million to \$2.8 million over the next year. EIC's funds are invested in TexPool, a completely liquid municipal pool account that is currently earning a dismal 0.24%.

The City received pricing on its debt refunding transaction on September 22nd. The EIC portion of the refunding received very favorable pricing that results in a true interest cost of only 1.26%. This means EIC will save \$175,638 over the remaining life of the debt. The transaction is scheduled to close on October 22, 2020.
