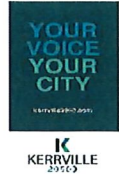

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**SUMMARY STATEMENT:**

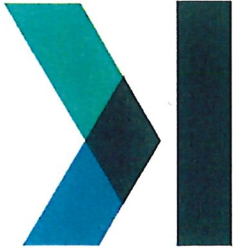
On April 13, 2021, the Senior Services Advisory Committee received approval from the City Council to submit an application to the American Association of Retired Persons (AARP) for Kerrville to be considered an Age-Friendly Community. On April 27, 2021, we received notification via email from AARP that our application had been approved!

Kerrville now joins eight other cities in Texas that have earned this designation. These include: Austin, Brownsville, Dallas, Fort Worth, Houston, Lancaster, Rowlett, and San Antonio. In the United States, there are currently 410 Age-Friendly Communities. With Kerrville's newly earned designation, that number rises to 411.

There are many benefits that are provided to communities that earn this designation. The Senior Services Advisory Committee will provide a presentation that outlines these benefits.

# Background

- The Senior Services Advisory Committee was created by the City Council in 2019 at the request of Mayor Blackburn.
- Part of the Kerrville 2050 Comprehensive Plan
  - Key Priority Area: Housing
  - Guiding Principle: H3 – Continue to leverage Kerrville as a retirement living destination.
  - Action Item: H3.1 – Market Kerrville as a destination location – an “escape” from big city living.



# Background

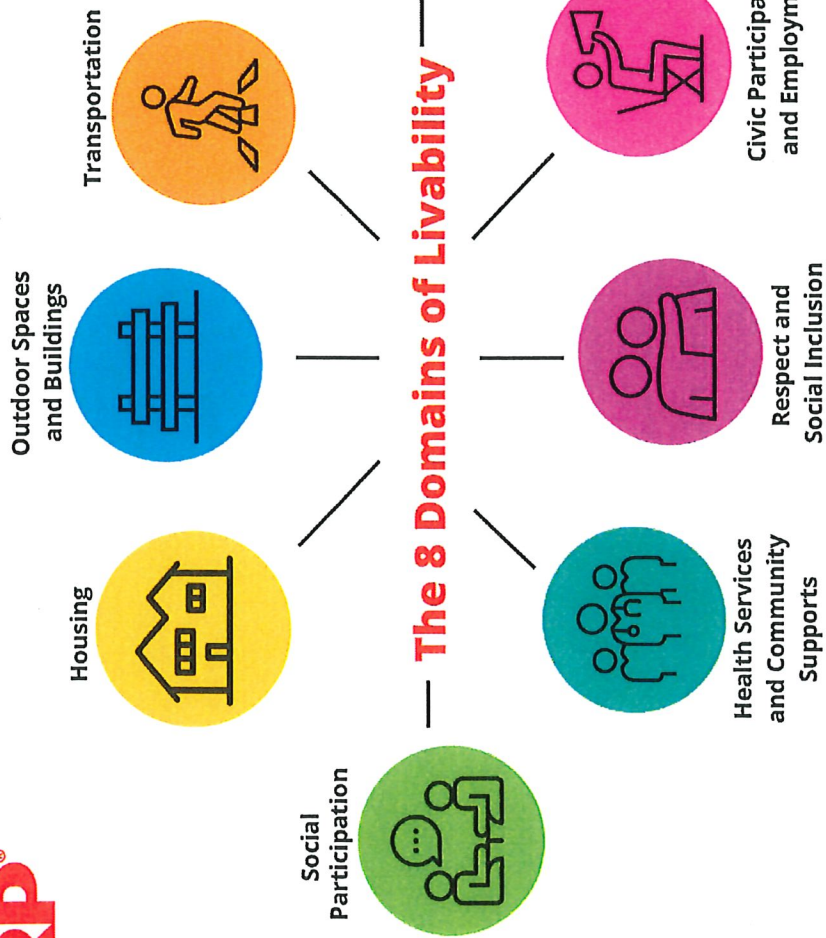
- A subcommittee of the SSAC began researching and working on the application process in 2019.
- 04/13/2021 – SSAC received a proclamation by the City Council to support our application to the AARP to have Kerrville designated as an Age-Friendly Community.
- 04/25/2021 - Submitted the application to the AARP.
- 04/27/2021 - Received approval and designation for Kerrville to be an AARP Age-Friendly Community.



# Kerrville Age-Friendly Community

- Kerrville now joins only eight other Texas cities to have earned this designation:
  - Austin, Brownsville, Dallas, Fort Worth, Houston, Lancaster, Rowlett and San Antonio.
- There are currently 523 Age-Friendly Communities in the United States.

# AARP Age-Friendly Benefits

- Serves as an organizing structure for making community improvements

- Provides leadership opportunities for volunteers

# AARP Age-Friendly Benefits

- Resources for identifying and assessing community needs
- Access to technical assistance and expert-led webinars
- Support and best practice materials from AARP





# AARP Age-Friendly Benefits

- Networking with other cities.
- Online livable library with numerous resources and free publications for community leaders to make their community more livable for all ages.
- Ability to apply for the **AARP Community Challenge Grant**

- Although communities that belong to the AARP Networks of Age-Friendly Communities are encouraged to apply, projects that benefit *any* community and satisfy all other criteria are eligible for consideration.



# AARP Community Challenge Grants

- The AARP Community Challenge provides small grants to fund quick-action projects that can help communities become more livable for people of all ages.
- Applications are accepted for projects to improve public spaces, housing, transportation, civic engagement, coronavirus recovery, diversity and inclusion, and more.
- The SSAC will apply for these grants in 2022.



# AARP Community Challenge Grants

- The AARP Community Challenge Grants provide funding to cities, counties, community groups, schools, and non-profit organizations to make physical improvements to their neighborhoods.
- Grants range from several hundred dollars for smaller short-term activities to several thousand or tens of thousands of dollars for larger projects.

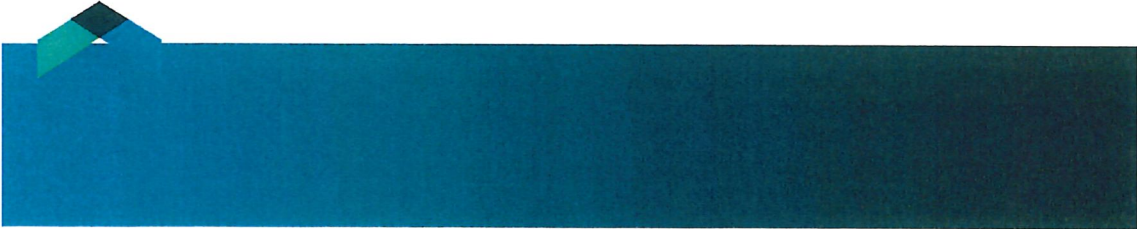
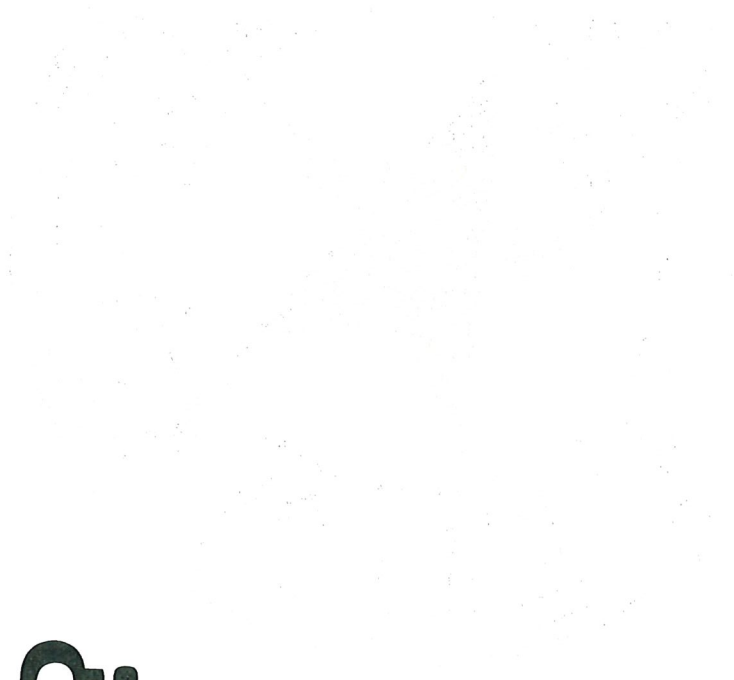




# AARP Community Challenge Grants

- Examples of previous winners of the AARP Community Challenge Grants have used their funds for:
  - *Hub and Spoke* program is to install repair stations along bike trails.
  - Installing benches, shade trees, and educational signage along a trail.
  - Installing four bus shelters along a state highway.
  - Enhance connectivity to public art in a newly activated space with benches, sidewalks, and lighting.
