## **DECLARATION OF DISASTER**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Kerrville, in the County of Kerr County, Texas, on this the 4<sup>th</sup> day of July, 2025, has suffered, and is continuing to suffer, widespread or severe damage, injury, and/or loss of life or property resulting from

### ***SEVERE FLOODING***

***from a weather event that brought rain that began overnight and continues***

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor of Kerrville has determined that extraordinary measures must be taken to alleviate the suffering of people and to protect or rehabilitate property;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED BY THE MAYOR OF KERRVILLE:**

**1. A LOCAL STATE OF DISASTER IS HEREBY DECLARED FOR THE CITY OF KERRVILLE PURSUANT TO §418.108(A) OF THE TEXAS GOVERNMENT CODE.**


2. Pursuant to §418.108(b) of the Government Code, the state of disaster shall continue for a period of not more than seven days from the date of this declaration unless continued or renewed by the City Council of Kerrville.

3. Pursuant to §418.108(c) of the Government Code, this declaration of a local state of disaster shall be given prompt and general publicity and shall be filed promptly with the City Secretary.

4. Pursuant to §418.108(d) of the Government Code, this declaration of a local state of disaster activates the City Emergency Management Plan.

5. This proclamation shall take effect immediately from and after its issuance.
