

KERRVILLE 2050 GUIDING PRINCIPLES AND ACTION ITEMS

P4 – Update the Parks Master Plan, other applicable codes and ordinances and capital planning and funding priorities to support Kerrville 2050.

P5 – Focus on enhancing / investing in existing parks, their purpose or repurpose and improving accessibility before acquiring land for new parks.

MASTER PLAN OVERVIEW


Current Parks and Recreation Master Plan - 2008.

Update will be complementary document to the Kerrville 2050 Comprehensive Plan.

10 year plan period with formal review after 5 years.

To follow format / approval by Texas Parks and Wildlife Department.

Adoption by TPWD provides opportunity for grant eligibility.



PARKS AND RECREATION MASTER PLAN 2022

Plan development began in 2021.

City staff and the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board (plan's steering committee) identified draft projects for plan inclusion.

Public Input Process:

- Public Input Meeting – December 15, 2021
- E-mail submissions with feedback also accepted
- Online Survey – Early 2022
- PRAB Board Review / Adoption – Spring 2022
- City Council and TPWD Adoption – Mid 2022
