





Catch The Importance of Being Earnest at the VK Garage theater, October 4th- 20th.





PrinterOn is an application that allows patrons to wirelessly print anywhere.


Head over to your app store on your device and download the application PrinterOn.

1. Once downloaded, on the bottom screen, locate and select “no printer selected.” Select “location” and “allow while using app.”
2. Select the only orange circle in Kerrville and select the icon that looks like a circle with an i.

Make sure NOT to select HC BW and HC Color

- Color—\$0.50

Don't worry if you have a particularly vocal child, or if they struggle to sit still for the duration of the program. That is all part of the learning experience! Caregivers and little ones are encouraged to wander around at the back of the room, or pop outside to utilize the playground if necessary. Children are always encouraged to return to the fun of Storytime as they are able. And it doesn't only benefit the children; caregivers also learn new ways to support their children's cognitive growth, and can continue to help them grow in between Storytime session.



Why Storytime?

When families attend a library Storytime, they learn valuable pre-literacy tools that prepare children to become readers and learners for life.

Why Songs?

Singing slows words down to make it easier for children to hear the sounds that form words. Clapping along with the songs helps children discover rhythm. Studies have shown that children who have learned at least eight nursery rhymes by the age of four are among the best readers in their grade by the age of eight.

Why do we make a show of handling the books?

Observing the librarian read a physical storybook, children learn the mechanics of how to hold a book, including proper book orientation and how to turn the page. As they listen to the story and see the illustrations and photographs, children make connections and build their vocabulary. The librarian will sometimes ask the audience what they think will happen next to develop communication skills.

Why Playtime?

Playtime at the end of Lapsit Storytime provides a safe space for children to learn cooperative play and sharing. It also allows caregivers the opportunity to connect with other caregivers who have children experiencing the same developmental milestones. This interaction allows caregivers to share valuable tips and develop ties within the community.

Why Crafts?

In addition to being fun, the craft at the end of Preschool Storytime allows for children to develop the fine motor skills needed to eventually write. The act of coloring, folding, gluing, cutting with scissors or tearing paper with their hands helps develop muscles and hand eye coordination. Participating in the craft teaches children to problem solve, as well as think about the next step required to complete a craft.
